





Fig 1. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of mounting base temperature





Fig 2. Continuous drain current as a function of mounting base temperature









Fig 6. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration





Fig 7. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values





Fig 8. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig 9. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 10. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 11. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig 12. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature





Fig 13. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature





Fig 14. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage





Fig 16. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values




